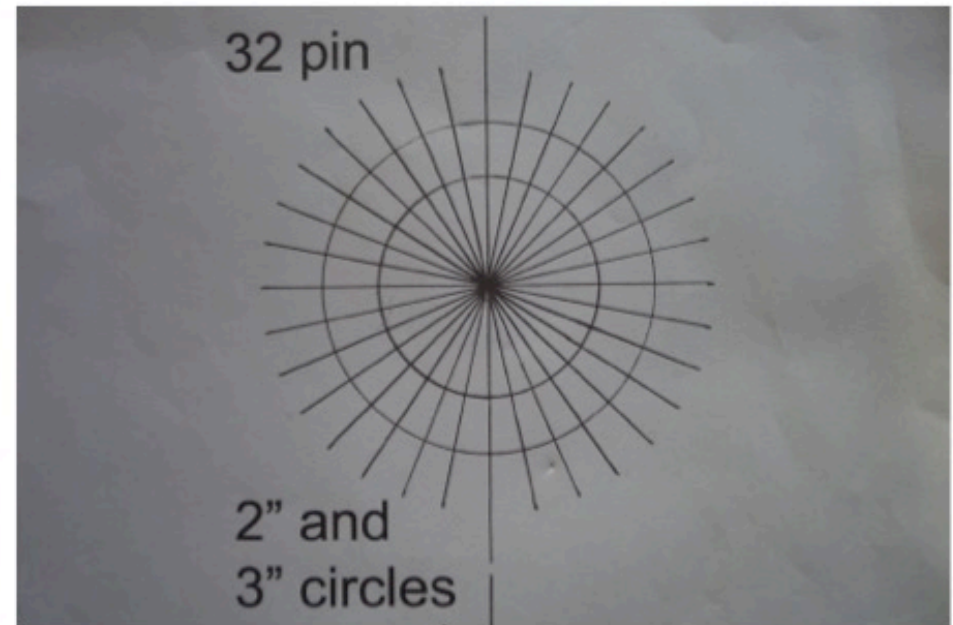
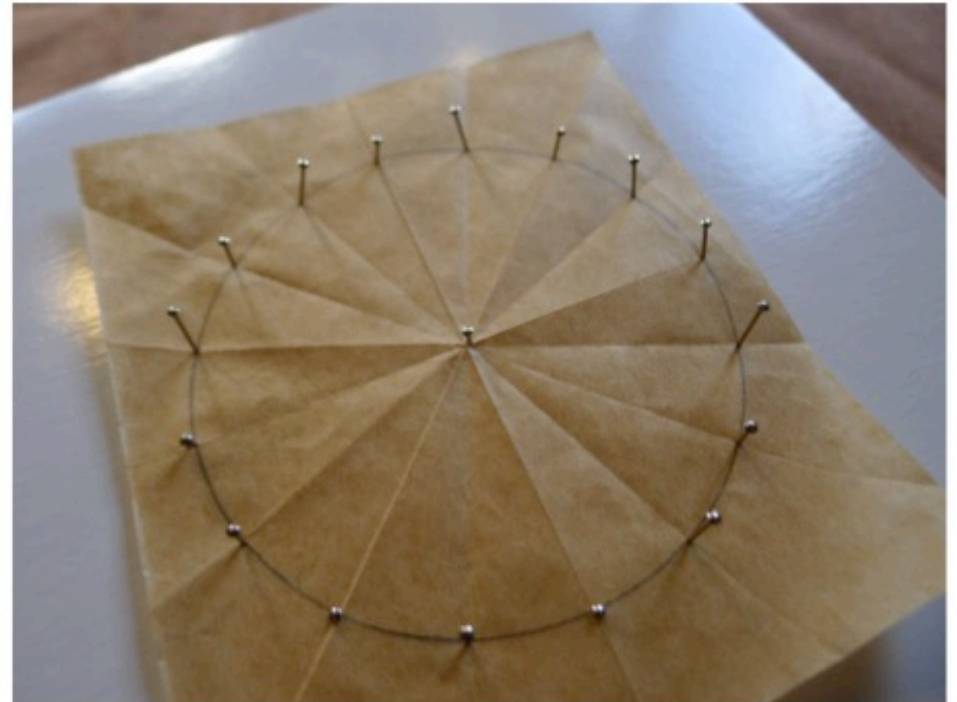
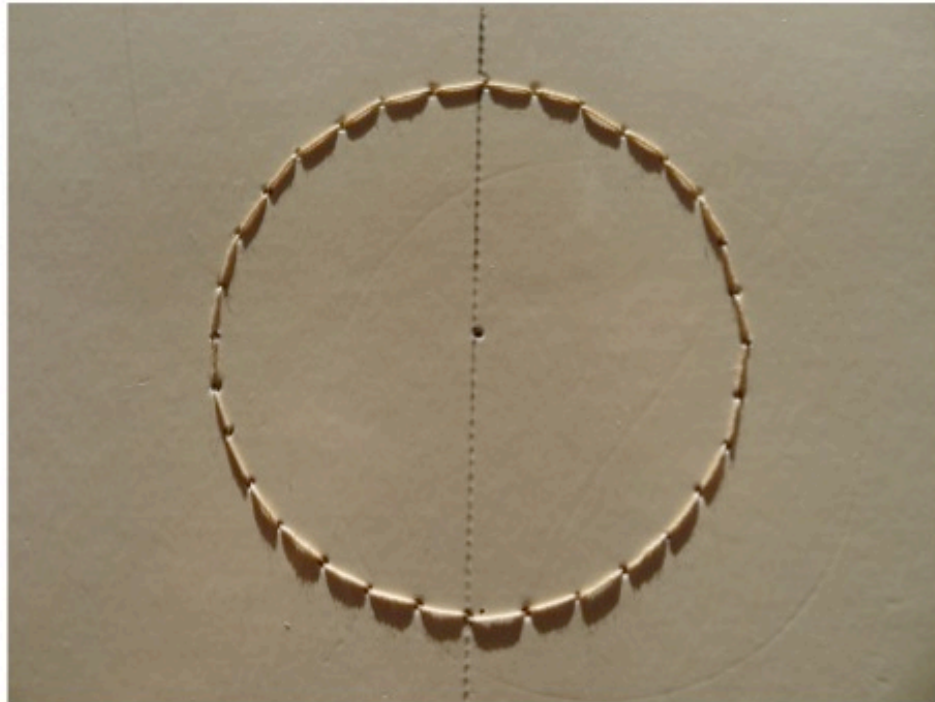


# Teneriffe Lace.

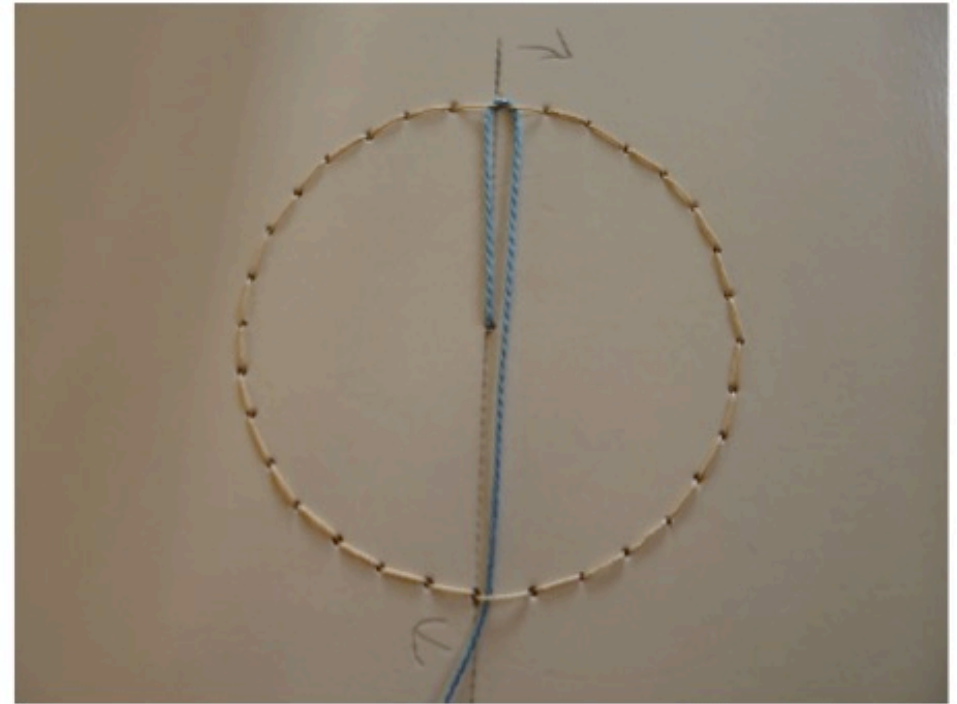
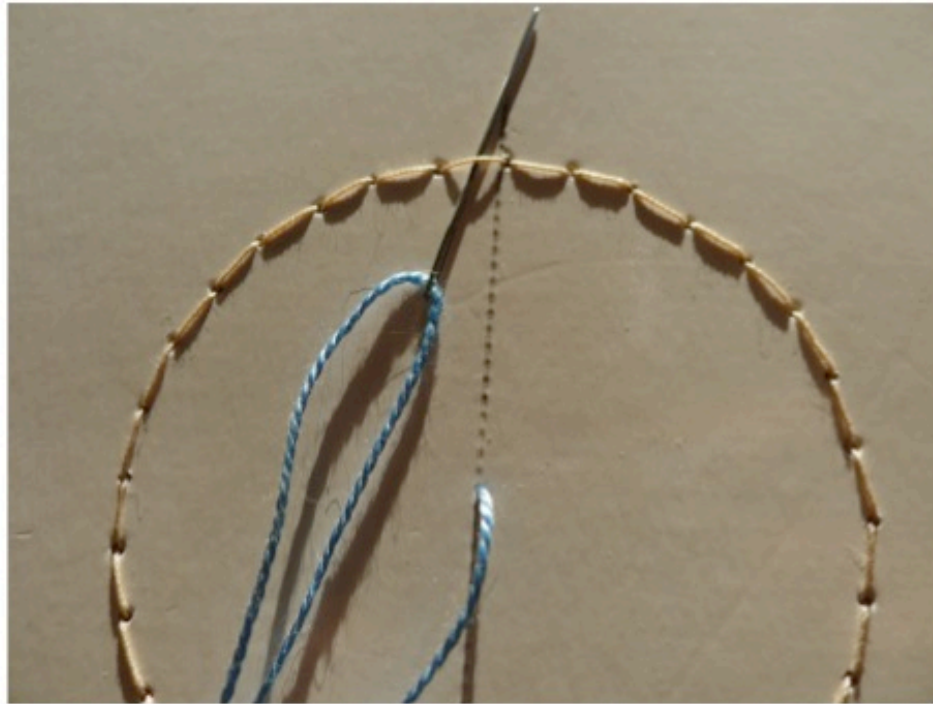
If you would like to join the workshop on 12<sup>th</sup> Dec but do not have a “pin circle” you can work the lace on card using a template like the one shown below. More details of how to find this template are on the Guild website.



A card “loom” for working the lace consists of a 3”,7.5 circle with the centre and 32 points around the circumference marked. Running stitches made with a strong disposable thread form the attachment points for the lace web. A circle drawn on greaseproof paper and carefully folded can be used to make the template which can be transferred to the card using pins.



Working the web for the lace is more tricky on card than using the pin circle. You need approx 10 ft, 3 m of lace thread treaded on to your needle. Starting from the back of the card, fix your thread then bring your needle to the front. Work around the circle looping the thread around the running stitches as shown, making sure your first cross-thread follows a diameter of the circle, work in a clockwise direction.





Continue working in this way around the circle until you have completed the web. Using your needle find the point at which your thread came from behind the card and thread your end through to the back of the card where it can be knotted off and trimmed.
